Benicia school board to consider further budget cuts

BENICIA — After deciding at their last meeting to beef up the district’s emergency fund, Benicia school board members on Thursday will continue exploring ways to save money in the coming school year.

The 7 p.m. meeting will be at

City Hall, 250 East L. St.

District officials expect to make at least \$1 million in budget cuts this year. Those could be accomplished by increasing class sizes, laying off teachers and other staff or reducing funding for certain programs.

On Thursday, the board will discuss possible layoffs of class-

fied staff like custodians and office workers.

The agenda also includes a vote on the seniority list for teachers, which helps determine who is laid off should the board vote to reduce staff.

The board will also vote on a revised student achievement plan for Benicia Middle School.

Comics raise money for AmCan program

AMERICAN CANYON — Hollywood comedian Dante, a former contestant on “The Last Comic Standing,” seemed a bit lost among the police officers and firefighters gathered to watch his show Saturday.

“Your town is fun. ... I have no idea where I am!” said Dante, who headlined the fourth annual fundraising event for the California Cadet Academy at the Gaia Napa Valley Hotel.

About 160 people attended the dinner and comedy night event that benefited the nonprofit academy, brainchild of American Canyon Police Officer Tony Heuschel.

“(The academy) is a career development program for high school students to explore careers in law enforcement, firefighting and (emergency medical service),” Heuschel said.

The fundraiser also featured a silent action and Sacramento-based comedian Patrick Jaye. The St. Louis native warmed up the crowd for Dante by largely joking about race issues.

The California Cadet Academy was founded in 2005 and holds a summer camp of sorts in Angwin.

It’s unclear how much money the fundraiser netted just yet, but it’ll be enough to subsidize the tuition for about 30 cadets this summer, Heuschel said. The organization will still continue to accept donations, however.

Registration is open immediately after the fundraiser, and the academy will recruit until June, Heuschel said. Recruits must be enrolled in high school, between 13 and 18 years old.
